

ABOUT THE COLLEGE



- Govt. Degree College Ramgarh affiliated to University of Jammu was established in the year 2019 by the Government of Jammu and Kashmir. The College is about 8 km away towards west from the National Highway. At present, the college is housed in the premises of Govt. Middle School Kalah, opposite Baba Sidh Goria Temple, Swankha. The college was initiated with an encouraging strength of 35 students covering both male and female in the first academic session 2019-20 in Arts stream. The emphasis is laid on activities and conscious effort to attract and retain talented students through regular influx of talented teaching faculty, monitoring and up-gradation of elements of infrastructure such as library, sports, Red Ribbon Club, NSS, NCC, Internet connectivity etc. There is enough space for restructuring and expansion that provides an atmosphere for students with choice and creates competitions among them.

• To achieve our objectives, besides class work, students are enrolled in different programs viz. Skill training Program & Career Counseling Programs to name of few. Also different Clubs of the College are conducting extra Curricular activities to achieve our goals

I. Extension Activities

1. <u>National Service Scheme (NSS)</u>



To foster a spirit of brotherhood, communal harmony, service to humanity in general and rural folk in particular among the students, the college provides the platform to the willing students. In this regard, the college established NSS Unit **"Prabha"** comprising of 100 volunteers who are willingly serving the Nation with discipline, dedication and devotion under the guidance of NSS programme officer of the college. NSS unit works as per directions and programme calendar issued by the NSS Programme Coordinator, university of Jammu. The NSS of the College has also adopted Govt. Middle School Kalah and Village Kalah.

2. <u>Red Ribbon Club</u>



RRC conducts awareness campaigns about HIV/AIDS, its prevention and treatment, promotes general Health and wellness among students. RRC Organizes seminars, workshops and discussions on sexual health and hygiene. It also trains and encourages students to spread awareness among their peers, engage in community service activities related to health and wellness and collaborate with local health organizations and NGOs.

3. <u>Eco Club</u>



Eco Club is one of the major initiatives of the College for creating environmental Awareness amongst young generation. It aims at building young cadres for working towards preservation and conservation of environment. Students are enrolled as members of the Eco Club under the supervision of a coordinator. Eco Club enables members to actively participate in the environmental activities and contribute towards fighting the climate change.

The Club remains active throughout the serious undertaking activities like environment campaigns, Poster-Making competitions, Cleanliness of water bodies, quizzes, water conservation activities, Plantation drives etc.

4. Narco Coordination Center club (NCORD)



The College has an active NCORD Committee that effectively works towards curbing the menace of Drug Abuse & Illicit trafficking of drugs by spreading awareness amongst the young learners. The Committee is dedicated to counseling of students against Drug Abuse by conducting multifarious activities ranging from sports, cultural activities, competitions, awareness lectures, Counseling Sessions etc. The Students are also administered e-Pledge to remind them of their duty towards Nation as a responsible citizen. Awareness Campaigns are conducted on regular basis to sensitize the youngsters about ill effects of drug abuse.

5. Language and Literary Club

The literacy club aims to introduce the students to the literature of various languages, and hence their appreciation for literature and introduce in them the skills for creative writing and expression. It helps the students to enhance their thoughts and speech through group discussions and interactive sessions.

6. Cultural and Fine Arts Club

The Club Organizes cultural events, competitions and celebrates festivals. It encourages students to participate in dance, music, drama and other cultural activities. The aim of the club is to Identify and nurture students talents in various art forms and provides platforms for students to showcase their talents.

7. Yuva Tourism Club

The club raises awareness about the conservation of cultural and Natural heritage. It engages in activities to preserve local heritage sites, organize trips and excursions to historical, cultural and natural sites, organizes tourism fairs, exhibitions and cultural shows.

8. <u>Electoral Literacy Club / SVEEP</u>

This club educates students about the importance of voting and their role as citizens provides information on the electoral process, voter registration and voting rights. It facilitate voter registration for eligible students, collaborates with the Election Commission and other relevant bodies to align club activities with national electoral initiatives. It also engages students in community outreach programs to promote electoral literacy beyond the college campus.

II. Modes to Empowerment

1. Sports



The College has department of sports and games to promote among the students the qualities of sportsmanship and to tap the nascent talent lying among the students of the area. The Department has good lot of sports material for meeting the true requirements of various sports activities in which students are continuously encouraged to participate including inter college as well as national tournament /competition from time to time.

Special emphasis is given to overall development of sports caliber of students, through various practice session held in the college before participating in actual event. College spared no stone unturned to train the college youth for sports activities through the dedicated team of staff members working for the cause.

2. Library



The college has a library to facilitate students for extra reading. To keep the knowledge of students update the college provides a viable & regular collection of magazines and daily newspaper. A spectrum of wide variety of books has been incorporated in the library to enrich the knowledge of the students on various disciplines. Books will be issued to the students on the production of the library-borrower-cards duly attested by principal which is issued to him/her at the beginning of the academic session by the librarian. The students are required to observe the following rules:

Library Rules

- The college library is open for students & staff from 9 A.M to 3 P.M. on all working days.
- Students are allowed to get issued only two books at a time which has to be returned within 14 days failing which a fine of Rs. 1 per day is charged.
- Silence is to be observed in the college library.
- Students are directed to handle books properly. If any page/pages is/are found missing the borrower will be punished under rules.
- If a borrowed book is lost/torn/spoiled the students responsible for it will be liable to replace it or pay the cost of the book.
- Students appearing for University examination shall surrender their library card before getting Roll no. slips.



3. Browsing Centre

The College has the well established Browsing Centre with eight Computers and a photocopier to facilitate the quest for knowledge of the students.

4. Smart Class Rooms



All the newly constructed class rooms are equipped with Smart Board /Interaction Board and Electronic Audio podium.

5. <u>Multipurpose Hall</u>



The College has the well established Multipurpose Hall for various extra-curricular and Co-curricular activities including seminars and workshop.

6. <u>Picnic and Subject Tour</u>



Picnic of the college is generally organized in the first week of February. This is an academic exercise which makes the students familiar with social and cultural heritage of the adjoining areas and state. The college also organizes the subject tour to acquaint the students regarding subject related issues.

III. Various Committees in the College

1. College Discipline Committee

The college is very particular in observing strict discipline in the premises, violation of which shall warrant punishment from the college authorities. For this the college has constituted rotational discipline committees which involve active participation of all the staff members for curbing any untoward incident within the college premises and inculcating in them a sense of discipline to groom their lives to face the challenges of the outside world. The college spares no effort to inculcate especially moral discipline among the students through our experienced and dedicated staff members.

2. <u>Anti-Ragging Cell</u>

As per the directions issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court, University of Jammu and Department of Higher Education, an anti-ragging cell has been established in the college to curb ragging in any form, on or off the college campus by establishing it as cognizable offence and the student /students indulging in this practice will be severely punished, which can include explanation and expulsion from the college.

3. <u>Grievance Redressal Cell</u>

The college has established a grievance redressal cell in the college. Any person among the students/staff can lodge his/her complaint with the cell and demand appropriate redressal. The students can also state their grievance regarding any academic and non-academic matter within the campus through online & grievance / suggestion box.

4. <u>Entrepreneurship / Innovation & Incubation Cell</u>

Our mission is to help the aspiring entrepreneurs start and grow their business by creating a pathway of various opportunities like interactive sessions with professionals, business corporate to increase the awareness. This helps to foster entrepreneurship thinking, promotes business knowledge and instills the confidence in every student. We research and develop new knowledge, transfer existing knowledge and provide education and training to ambitious students.

5. <u>Committee against sexual harassment (CASH)</u>

The College premises are under CCTV Surveillance 24x7.



- 5. Three identical copies of a recent passport size photograph.
- 6. Matriculation certificate (in original) and two self attested copies.
- 7. Transfer Certificate of father or guardian in case of children of Military/Paramilitary Personnel or Central Government Employees.

College Rules and Regulations
